Locate Your Legislator

Every ten years, the Indiana General Assembly redraws legislative district maps. Here is a guide to help you better understand the district you are in. For some, you may have a new legislator.

As it stands now, House members are currently representing their old districts but will be running in November 2012 in their new districts. However, the Senate is currently operating under their new districts which they will also be seeking reelection in 2012.

For the new districts, the IGA released a few maps online which show district boundaries. These maps you kind of have to match up accordingly—one is street level view but does not include a district number. However, with the Google one you can determine the shape of the district and match it accordingly to the other one with numbers.
