
**The Explorer's Code**

Charlie, Anna and Emily all arrive at Idlewood Manor for different reasons but soon team up to discover their mysterious past and the famous female explorer connected to it.




**The Fabled Life of Aesop**

Max wasn't expecting a tough time at knight school. When her best friend Byjovia is attacked, they have to face their biggest enemy yet!




**The Comeback**



By *Victoria Jamieson*



When radium is discovered in the early 1920s, its exciting glow looks promising for lots of products. But when people begin getting ill, a shocking truth is uncovered.




**Bloom**

After losing nearly everything in the Syrian revolution, Yara must navigate her way to a new life of freedom for her and her brother.




**Clean Getaway** by *Nic Stone*
